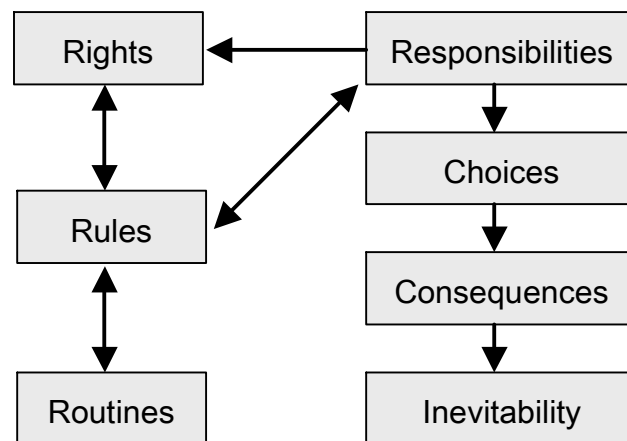


THE 4R'S FRAMEWORK



Rights for all members of Boldon School

- All pupils have the right to learn.
- All teachers have the right to teach.
- All members of the school have the right to feel safe – both physically and emotionally.
- All members of the school have the right to be treated with dignity and respect.

Boldon School needs RULES and ROUTINES so that we can all experience these RIGHTS.

Rules

- All pupils should follow the directions of a teacher immediately and without questioning or arguing.
- All pupils should remain silent when a teacher is speaking.
- All members of the school should keep their hands, feet and possessions to themselves.
- All members of the school should refrain from abusive or aggressive language.
- All members of the school should respect the personal space of others.
- All members of the school should show respect to teachers, all other adults and pupils.
- All pupils should wear the school uniform correctly: the only jewellery permitted is one watch, one pair of ear studs and one signet ring, no piercing.

- All members of the school should refrain from smoking on or near the school campus.
- All mobile phones, walkmans, DVD players and MP3s must be switched off and kept out of sight in classrooms and in the corridors.

* NB The school takes no responsibility for any jewellery or personal equipment brought into school.

Routines

- All pupils must arrive at lessons on time and must line up quietly and sensibly.
- All pupils must enter the classroom quietly when instructed to do so by the teacher; they must remove their outdoor coats and get ready for work.
- All pupils must sit in class according to the teacher's seating plan.
- All pupils must bring the correct equipment and planners to each lesson.
- All pupils must work hard without distracting others.
- All pupils must answer questions in class according to the agreed manner.
- All pupils must wait for the teacher to instruct them to leave the classroom.
- All pupils must follow department routines.
- All pupils must walk on the left hand side of corridors and staircases and move quickly and quietly to their lessons.
- All pupils must follow school routines for assemblies and examinations.

It is the responsibility of all members of the community to behave in a way that protects the rights of others.

Everyone is responsible for the choices they make and the consequences of those choices.

Responsibility and Choice

- Positive choices will lead to positive feedback or rewards.
- Negative choices will lead to correction and sanctions.
