<b>Knowledge &amp; Understanding (National Curriculum)</b> <i>Skills are across the whole year.</i>	<p>Year 11 Business Curriculum has been designed to ensure students are able to achieve the highest standards and outcomes. The Business &amp; Enterprise curriculum enables students to learn a wide range of skills and to develop good business knowledge. BTEC Business &amp; Enterprise allows learners to eventually access university, apprenticeships and into the world of business. Business pupils to develop sector specific applied knowledge and understanding through realistic vocational context. Pupils will learn characteristics of enterprises and entrepreneurs and internal and external factors that can affect the success of an enterprise. A focus of developing key skills that prove aptitude in planning an enterprise idea, including market research, planning, carrying out financial transactions, communication and problem solving. These key skills will ensure Baldon School pupils are ready for the workplace and wider world. Business students are taught by subject specialists to ensure high quality and consistent teaching. All skills are sequenced from year 10 and 11 students are progressing each year and they can continuously retrieve information from each project. High quality questioning and resources are used during practical lessons and theory lessons. Our assessment structure is designed to ensure students can apply their knowledge while developing business skills through exploring ideas, planning, pitching micro-enterprises and developing promotions. In addition, learners will be taught how to problem solve, examine, make connections, develop, communicate and collaborate. Students will examine both successful and unsuccessful businesses, so that they can develop their knowledge and understanding of the business concepts that will enhance their own decision making. Students will then learn what it means to set up and run a business enterprise, and complete assignments that encourage them to be creative and yet realistic.
